In the footsteps of the salt workers | Bad Hall

On this tour, you will learn how the spa and health resort of Bad Hall came into being and discover the miraculous effects of the iodine-bromine healing waters.

The tour starts at the tourist office in front of the Kurhaus. The route takes you down to the "cradle of the spa," the millennia-old Tassilo Spring, with the salt boiler and the bread baker.

Nobles, entrepreneurs, princes, and industrialists met in the spa gardens, deliberately avoiding the poor people and scabby children who only received healing baths during the night. The rich villa culture with

its famous guests is the focus of the walk through the venerable English spa gardens, where disrespectful ne'er-do-wells also roamed. The spa doctor treated all kinds of illnesses, including syphilis or lues, which was whispered about behind closed doors. Exceptional successes have been achieved since fundamental research into eye treatment began. The 90-minute tour ends in the Forum Hall of the City Museum with an immersion into the old spa culture and the great successes of the Paracelsus Institute.

Reichraming Woodcutter Museum

As early as the end of the 14th century, timber was being felled in the forests of the Reichraming Hintergebirge mountains. The timber was transported by water along the drift paths. It was not until the First World War that a forest railway was built, which ran from the 'Wallerhütte', now the Holz knecht Museum, to the district of Schallau, among other places.

The Wallerhütte, which was once the evening gathering place and, during the winter months, a second home for the woodcutters, now houses the Reichraming Woodcutter Museum. The exhibition documents their way of life and work in the 19th and 20th centuries with tools, models and images. On the upper floor of the museum, historically valuable brass objects and an impressive model of the Reichraming brass factory enrich the museum's exhibition.

Furthermore, the special exhibition 'The fossilised world beneath the woodcutters' feet' allows visitors to marvel at remarkable fossils from the Reichraming Hintergebirge mountains.

An artistic apiary has been set up in the museum's outdoor area to provide an insight into the beekeeping practised by many woodcutters. Visitors also have the opportunity to taste original Holz knecht-nock'n.

On the Gaflenzbach stream in Weyer, just before it flows into the Enns, you will find this old, fully operational mill dating from 1820. It was dismantled at its old location and rebuilt true to the original on the Gaflenzbach stream by the Katzensteiner family in 1978. See for yourself how romantic this destination is. The Katzensteiner mill and its surroundings, including the Troadkasten and Gattersäge, have

been lovingly renovated in recent years. In the Schäumühle, you can see how flour and semolina are produced. The Troadkasten shows the history of milling.
Frame saw – This wooden frame saw, built around 1830, was in operation in Weyer (Aignersäge) from 1904 to 1953. A model shows the entire operation of a frame saw. Troadkasten – dating from 1850, showing the history of milling.

Mining and Local History Museum Miners' House Unterlaussa

In the faithfully reconstructed 'Knappenhaus vom Blahberg' (Blahberg Miners' House), you can experience a journey through time and learn about the mining history of the region. Iron, coal, jet and bauxite were the raw materials that were mined here. Dr Oskar Kortan, a former mining engineer in our district, has provided the Unterlaussa Miners' House with numerous mining artefacts from all over the world, some of which are up to 6,000 years old.

Upstairs, special exhibition: Classic motorcycles from the region.

All of the motorcycles were owned by residents of Unterlaussing during their lifetime. So these machines are returning to their old home, at least for a short time. Motorcycle collector Christian Michtner from Admont has collected these gems over many years of passionate collecting and is now showing them to the public for the first time. Puch, KTM, Horex, Ducati and other brands are the names of the machines on display.

Special exhibition: Unterlaussa at that time in sound, images and film.

The history of the village in the Laussatal valley is presented here. Old photographs, sound recordings and films show everyday culture and economic activity in earlier times. The documentation of the expeditions of primary school teacher Kurt Redl to Spitsbergen is also fascinating.

Virtuelles Weißwasser - The branch of the Unterlaussa miners' house in the Reichraminger Hintergebirge

Here, the Weißwasser mining settlement in the Reichraminger Hintergebirge, which was demolished in the 1960s, can be seen and experienced again virtually. This is done using augmented reality (AR) via an app on a mobile phone or tablet.

Over a length of around 800 metres on the display, the houses and barracks, the cable car station, the locksmith's shop, the joinery, the sawmill and the fire station are visible again. Over a length of around 800 metres on the display, the

Poachers Museum Molln – Jew's harp & crafts | Molln

As Austria's only poaching museum, we present the history of poaching from the Middle Ages to the present day, supplemented by a presentation of the events of a regional tragedy, the Mollner poaching drama. Thanks to the acquisition of the extensive collection of Prof. Dr. Roland Girtler and the Walder brothers, the topic of poaching can be shown in many facets. An extensive collection of rare weapons rounds off the exhibition.

Founded as a craft museum focusing on woodworking and ironworking, the Wilderer Museum Molln offers a unique overview of the history of poaching. Established in 1998 for the Upper Austrian provincial exhibition 'Land of Hammers – Home of Eisenwurzen' in the old vaults of the farm building of the former Molln forestry office of the Steyr manorial estate (now a village inn), our museum has continued to develop. The examination of the development of living conditions in the village and the working world of the villagers as an important aspect of village culture is related to the most important resources of the region: wood, iron and water. A diverse and interesting collection of local specialities awaits you in our museum.

Jew's harp

The manufacture of Jew's harps in Molln can be traced back to 1647 – this long tradition of producing these forged instruments is unique in Austria. This pocket instrument, whose production was recognised as intangible cultural heritage by the Austrian UNESCO Commission in 2014, is the subject of a dedicated exhibition, including a demonstration workshop on jaw harp production. Scythe production also played an important role in the economic development of Molln.

Craft

Woodworking in particular achieved tremendous diversity in Molln – in addition to shovel makers, there were also rake makers, wheelwrights and many more.

The museum is wheelchair accessible, has a large (bus) car park and a disabled toilet. Right next to the museum is the Wirt inn in the village.

Horse shoe and chisel forge – Lindermayr Schauschmiede | Spital am Pyhrn

Over 500 years ago, the horseshoe and hoe forge was the 'court forge' of Spital Abbey, and from 1808 onwards, it served as a tool forge for carters, woodcutters and farmers for more than 150 years.

The former court smithy of Spital am Pyhrn Abbey was established in the period after 1300 as a result of trade to and from Venice. The first documented blacksmith, Andreas, still worked for the hospital. Andreas Ferdinand Lindermayr took over the court smithy at a time when the baroqueisation of the abbey promised fruitful work. The artistic lines of the closing grille of the abbey church, which he completed in 1734, became famous.

The blacksmith delivered his orders as far as the middle Steyr Valley, including grave crosses, window baskets, tavern signs and door fittings. His son Matthäus expanded the business to include a milling shop and a general store, and also ran a gunsmith's and watchmaker's workshop.

The renovation carried out for the 1998 provincial exhibition made it possible to set up a show smithy. It also includes an exhibition on the history of the smithy and the blacksmith's craft with interesting exhibits.

How do extreme mountaineers think and feel? What does it take to climb the highest peaks? What do the 8,000-meter peaks look like from above? You will find the answers to these questions and lots of other interesting information in this extraordinary museum.

The patron of the 400 m² exhibition is Gerlinde Kaltenbrunner, a native of Spital and extreme mountaineer. She was the first woman to climb all 14 eight-thousanders without bottled oxygen.

You can experience what she experienced on the world's eight-thousanders in this museum, which is unique in Europe. It presents the history of alpinism, the physical and mental requirements for extreme mountaineering, and the special features and phases of an 8,000-meter expedition in a vivid and modern way.

In the experience room, visitors get an impression of the extreme altitude and steepness of the walls and feel the force of the wind. Original footage of the avalanche that destroyed the Mount Everest base camp in 2015 is also shown.

The entrance to the museum is located in the monastery building near the K2 sculpture.

Wild herbs at St. Sebaldus Herb walk followed by a wild herb snack at Heiligenstein

We hike along meadows and through species-rich forests to Heiligenstein. This historic hill between Weyer and Gaflenz is home to the popular pilgrimage church of St. Sebaldus with an adjoining snack bar. The path to the 782-metre-high Heiligenstein is lined with flowers and wild herbs. The R 8 family cycle path runs close to the River Steyr with its bathing spots, rest areas, adventure stations, viewpoints and canyons – from Steyr in the north to St. Pankraz in the south. The Steyr Valley Cycle Path is also very suitable for families as it is largely flat. Steam locomotives once roared along here:

The Untergrünburg - Klaus section follows the route of the Steyr Valley Railway almost continuously. Today, this is operated as a museum railway between Steyr and Grünburg.

To the north, the tour can be extended to the town of Steyr. To the south, the tour can be extended from St. Pankraz on the National Park Cycle Route R 31 via Windischgarsten to Spital/Pyhrn. Or you can connect the R 31 with the Hintergebirgsradweg R 8 and the Ennsradweg R 7, thus completing the loop in Steyr. North of Klaus, the Steyrtalradweg connects to the Kremstalradweg R 10.

Insider tip: The ideal start to a cycling tour in the Steyr Valley is to take the Steyr Valley Museum Railway from Steyr to Grünburg on weekends from June to October. Bike transport is free!

Enns Cycle Path R7 – from the national park to the Danube

This section of the 263 km Enns Cycle Path leads through the hilly landscape of the Kalkalpen National Park region to the town of Steyr and on to the confluence of the Enns and Danube rivers near Enns.

TIP: Variant from Unterlaussa via the Hintergebirgsradweg R 9 cycle path through the forest wilderness of the Kalkalpen National Park to Reichraming.

Highlights: Ennstal National Park Visitor Centre in Reichraming, Gruber Carriage Museum in Großraming, Valley of the Feitelmacher in Trattenbach, historic old town of Steyr

Hintergebirgsradweg R9 cycle route – following in the footsteps of the forest railway

The 54.4 km Hintergebirgsradweg cycle path is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful cycle routes in Europe. It is a leisurely ride along the flat gravel path beside the

Großer Bach stream into the heart of the national park. Much of the route follows the former forest railway line. It ran through the Hintergebirge mountains for the last time in 1971. Adventure stations, reconstructions of a wooden giant and a Lafthütte hut, and the numerous tunnels make the cycle tour particularly appealing. (622 m elevation gain)

Trans National Park | 240 km and 7,400 metres of elevation gain

The TRANS NATIONALPARK leads from Steyr to Johnsbach. From the Upper Austrian Ennstal valley through the Kalkalpen National Park to the Pyhrn-Priel holiday region and on to the Gesäuse National Park in Styria – across the hilly landscape of the Alpine foothills. The extraordinary landscapes of the national park and its surroundings promise unique experiences.

Christkindl pilgrimage church

The centerpiece of the world-famous pilgrimage site "Christkindl" is the Baroque pilgrimage church. The church was built at the beginning of the 18th century by Carlo Antonio Carlone and Jakob Prandtauer and consecrated in 1725 by the Bishop of Passau, Joseph Dominikus Lamberg. The focal point is the ten-centimeter-tall wax figure of the Christ Child in a small shrine.

History

In 1695, Ferdinand Sertl, a seriously ill tower keeper and chapel master, placed a small wax figure of the baby Jesus in the hollow of a spruce tree. He visited this place several times a week to pray. When he was miraculously cured of his epilepsy, so many pilgrims came that it became necessary to build a church. The name "Zum Christkindl unterm Himmel" (The Christ Child under the Sky) was chosen. The present church was begun in 1702 by Carlo Antonio Carlone and completed in 1708 by Jakob Prandtauer.

The miraculous figure, a standing baby Jesus only 10 cm tall, made of wax and holding a cross and crown of thorns in his hands, is now located on the high altar in a small shrine above the tabernacle, which is shaped like a globe.

Christkindl Pilgrimage - Christkindl – Garsten – Steyr – Christkindl

From the pilgrimage church in Christkindl, you will embark on a pilgrimage in the footsteps of Ferdinand Sertl, whose healing led to the founding of Christkindl. The first stage leads to Garsten (walking time: approx. 1 hour), where Anselm Angerer, the builder of Christkindl Church, was abbot of the Benedictine monastery at the time. The route then continues along the River Enns to Steyr and the parish church, where Ferdinand Sertl was town bandmaster and supervisor of the fire station at the town parish tower. (Walking time: approx. 50 min). The last stage leads back to Christkindl, where Ferdinand Sertl was cured of epilepsy after patient prayer. (Walking time: approx. 30 min).

Total walking time approx. 2.5 hours

Information about guided pilgrimages is available from the Christkindl parish office.
The pilgrimage route is marked with white and green signs and is accessible all year round.

Garsten Collegiate Church & Museum

The former Baroque collegiate church in Garsten is well worth seeing. The adjoining rooms, which include the summer choir, chapter house, Losensteiner Chapel, and sacristy, house an exhibition of sacred objects and works of art by M. Rittinger (boxwood nativity scene), Johann K. von Reslfeldt, and others.

Pilgrimage church Heiligenstein | Gafrenz

The pilgrimage site to St. Sebald, visible from afar high above Gafrenz, has been unique since the 15th century. The mountain church on the 782 m high hill between Gafrenz and Weyer is the only Sebaldus church in Austria. St. Sebald is considered an intercessor in times of illness and misfortune, a patron saint of livestock, and even a matchmaker.

In 2013, the Heiligenstein themed trail was opened: at several stations in and around the church, visitors can learn the most important information about the history of the mountain sanctuary, its significance as a place of pilgrimage, and the work of St. Sebald.

Several hiking trails lead romantically through woods and fields and invite visitors to visit the church and the snack bar. Since 2020, Heiligenstein has been the highlight of the Sebaldusweg trail through the national park region, and in 2024 the Sebalustour—a pilgrimage by bike—was opened.

Church tour of the "Pyhrn Cathedral" | Spital am Pyhrn

With the collegiate church, important artists of the Austrian Baroque created a total work of art full of astonishing harmony. Domenico Antonio Carlone decorated the interior of the church with his calm color scheme and magnificent stucco pilasters. The frescoes by Bartolomeo Altomonte in the presbytery represent a highlight of Baroque church painting in Upper Austria. The closing grille made by Andreas

Ferdinand Lindemayr is considered one of the most beautiful pieces of wrought ironwork in Austria. Artistic sensibility and faith have created such a magnificent house of worship. North of the church, in the so-called "Dechantstöckel," is the treasury of the former Spital Abbey. Documents, vestments, and liturgical objects were kept there. Now, particularly valuable sculptures, chasubles, and historically significant documents relating to the abbey and the two churches can be viewed in the treasury.

The crypt beneath the presbytery of the collegiate church was the burial place of the canons of Spital am Pyhrn. From January 25 to May 15, 1945, the entire gold treasure of the Hungarian National Bank (33,000 kg) was stored here. The crypt was restored in 1992.

Benediktweg

Back in 2009, on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the repopulation of the Benedictine Abbey of St. Paul in the Lavant Valley, a pilgrimage route named after St. Benedict of Nursia, the patron saint of Europe, was established along the path once taken by the monks. The Benedict Way is a path of encounter and movement in many ways: with culture, art, monasteries, nature, and people. It seeks to connect me and all who walk it with God, with each other, and with myself.

The trail allows you to find peace and inner reflection, experience community and hospitality, but also feel transformation. And it teaches you to perceive creation more consciously.

The "Ursprungsweg" (Path of Origins) leads from Spital am Pyhrn to St. Paul in the Lavant Valley and back again. In 2011, it was extended to Gornji Grad (Slovenia). In cooperation with other pilgrimage routes, it should eventually be possible to walk "in the footsteps of St. Benedict from monastery to monastery through Europe" to Montecassino (central Italy), the mother monastery of the Benedictine Order and the tomb of St. Benedict. And from there, it will also lead north to Pluscarden, the northernmost European (and Scottish) Benedictine monastery.

Benedict Pilgrimage Trail Kremstal

The Benedict Pilgrimage Trail Kremstal is a circular route that branches off from the main Benedict Pilgrimage Trail Schlierbach and leads through the beautiful Upper Austrian Kremstal valley over a distance of 50 km and three days.

Nestled in the beautiful valley landscape are the villages of Schlierbach, Nußbach, Wartberg, Inzersdorf, Micheldorf, and the district capital Kirchdorf. The route through these villages is mostly very moderate and flat, with only the ascent to the Grillparz—a magnificent vantage point over the entire valley—and the path up to the Magdalenaberg church involving some elevation gain.

The trail leads from the Cistercian Abbey of Schlierbach past Dorff Castle through the villages of Hofern and Ellersbach directly onto the new dam path from the retention basin in the Krems floodplains. Along the Krems River, there are wonderful rest areas where you can pause, enjoy the scenery, and recharge your batteries. The frequent changes in perspective are also impressive, with the Cistercian Abbey of Schlierbach, Magdalenaberg Church, Georgenberg, and Altpernstein Castle showing themselves from their best sides, yet the fascination remains the same.

Nativity scene exhibition in the Palm House

Highlights of nativity scene art

Highlights of the exhibition in the Palm House include the Baroque Lamberg nativity figures and the so-called "wagon nativity scene" by Josef Seidl from the Mühlviertel region, which was created especially for the "Light into Darkness" campaign. This "rolling nativity scene" was installed in an ÖBB railway carriage and traveled through Austria, Liechtenstein, Italy, and Germany during Advent in 1992 and 1997 as an advertising medium for the ORF charity campaign "Licht ins Dunkel." Both nativity scenes are sure to delight young and old alike with their wealth of figures and details.

The Baroque nativity scene from Lamberg Castle, together with its precious collection of figures, comes from the family estate of Count Josef Lamberg. It was donated to the Steyr City Museum in 1914 by his wife Anna, the daughter of weapons factory founder Josef Werndl. Today, the valuable collection comprises more than 200 clothed figurines, most of which came from various church nativity scenes. There are interactive stations for children and families in the exhibition, appropriate for the Advent season. Guided tours of the nativity scene exhibition in the Palm House are offered throughout the year by appointment.

Hunter's nativity scene at Teufelsbach

The open-air nativity scene at Teufelsbach in the Wehrgraben district, near the museum railway station, was founded in 1996 by Siegfried Jäger. After his death, responsibility for the nativity scene was transferred to the Steyr emergency shelter in 2004. During his lifetime, Mr. Jäger was promised that the name "Jägerkrippe" would remain. Life-size wooden figures are redecorated every year. The nativity scene is run as an employment project, with the voluntary requirement that no alcohol be served. In 2006, the first items produced in the creative workshop began to be offered for sale at the nativity scene. This involves the residents of the emergency shelter in all aspects of the work, providing a sense of achievement for everyone and an unusual attraction for Steyr.

Pilgrimage church Christkindl

In 1695, Ferdinand Sertl, a seriously ill tower keeper and chapel master, placed a small wax figure of the baby Jesus in the hollow of a spruce tree. He went there several times a week to pray. When he was cured of epilepsy, so many pilgrims came that it became necessary to build a church. The name "Zum Christkindl unterm Himmel" (The Christ Child under the Sky) was chosen. Construction of the present church was begun in 1702 by Carlo Antonio Carlone, and in 1708 Jakob Prandtauer took over the building work. The miraculous figure, a standing baby Jesus made of wax, only 10 cm tall, holding the cross and crown of thorns in his hands, is now located on the high altar in a small shrine above the tabernacle, which is shaped like a globe. For everyone looking for something special

Garstner Advent is one of the most beautiful in the country. It has been held since 1977 and takes place against the picturesque backdrop of the baroque monastery.

Traditional market at Platzl

The market is known for its cosy and inviting atmosphere and is a meeting place for young and old alike. Farmers, bakers, beekeepers, hunters and chocolatiers offer delicacies from the rural region at the market. Mulled cider, punch and herbal tea are made according to old family recipes. At Platzl, woodcarvers, artists and blacksmiths present "living crafts", and carpenters work with round timber using traditional chopping techniques. "Living arts and crafts" such as glass painting and wooden jewellery are on display in the community event hall and in the Garsten primary school.

Garsten Collegiate Church

The collegiate church was built by the master builders Carlone between 1677 and 1685 and is one of the most beautiful High Baroque buildings in Austria. Tapestries of Dutch origin (1675), Lenten veils by Schmidt of Krems (1777), the Losensteiner Chapel (burial place of the Losensteiner family), the sacristy and the summer choir are the special works of art.
